Summary: These areas are cut and whipped on a regular basis approximately every week and a half dependant on weather. Most of the work is done by summer students employed by the Town of Elk Point for the summer months.

ENVIRONMENTAL ACTION

The Town of Elk Point currently does garbage pickup for the residents once per week.

With the Extended Producer Responsibility program, we will be transitioning to a blue box recycling by 2026 along with our weekly pickup.

The Town of Elk Point currently operates a transfer station southwest of Elk Point along highway 646.

The Transfer station currently recycles tires, electronics, cardboard, newspaper, concrete, asphalt, paint, mattresses, appliances, used oil, oil containers, oil filters and scrap metal. The Extended Producer Responsibility program will see that list added with plastics, glass, etc. This should be starting at transfer station in late 2024 to 2025 to be implemented.

We were very proud to be selected as collection site of the year in 2011 and have been commended every year from the judge on our site.

In 2012 the Town of Elk Point began a project to promote alternate power sources by installing a total of 8 solar lights along the 50 Ave walking trail and again in 2014 another 8 were installed along the same walking trail along with 2 more in our Eco Center area.

In 2024 we will be replacing the original lights installed in 2012 with newer versions because of unavailability of batteries and parts for old ones.

We are the only site in the area that runs a compost site with 2 certified operators on staff. The site has been running since 2000

Residents bring in their grass clippings, garden waste along with any other organic compostables. The staff then looks after turning of rows and mixing.

Compost is made available to the residents free of charge with the majority of the compost being used by public works in operations.

Our flower boxes and flower beds are 90% our own composted soil at this time.

The Town of Elk Point does not do any spraying of herbicides or pesticides in the town limits as we prefer to explore other alternatives which include picking by hand, mowing or overseeding to choke out weed growth.








HISTORY

Enter our site and see the history of a small town in rural Alberta, Canada, starting in the late 1700's and continuing to today. Elk Point's history is connected to the Indigenous people of the area, the Fur Traders of Fort George and Buckingham
House, the early pioneers of the agricultural area, the businesses that started with the coming of the CNR, and the oil and gas industry of today. We hope to show you the development of Jaw and order, Education, communications, health
services, entertainment, recreation, transportation, and Joorgan local government. We hope this website serves as a resource to all those tracing their family roots in the area. We hope our words, pictures, sounds, and videos are of interest to you. We hope you are able to add to our knowledge of the area. We are indebted to those researchers who compiled the original REFLECTIONS book in 1977 and the SUPPLEMENT book in 1978. This forms the core of this site, along with books from other communities.







Elk Point's landmark Historical Mural is located in a tree-lined park west of the Elk Point Municipal Library on 50 Ave. and tells the story of the Elk Point area from before the birth of the community to its 80th birthday.

Early in 1987, to commemorate those 80 years of settlement and growth, Elk Point Historical Society began coordinating a mural project that "grew" from a modest proposal for an historical scene painted on a wall of a downtown business to a 100-foot-long series of panels covered with historical images spanning more than 100 years.

Local artist and history buff Billie Milholland researched and painted it over the year and a half that followed, with the community as a whole contributing old photos, anecdotes and memories and posing as models for the dozens of personalities represented in the mural.


Peter Fidler

Apr 19, 1788, 19 yr old PETER FIDLER signed a 5 yr contract (as a labourer) with the Hudson Bay Company. He proved to be an exceptionally bright and motivated person, so was quickly promoted to trading post journal writer.

From Fidler's Journal, Feb 7, 1791 when he was 22 years old & had just spent the winter with the Chipewyan people:

"This night dreamed in the Chipewyan language for the first time and I appeared to have a more extensive command of words when asleep than when awake."

In the fall of 1794 25 yr old Peter FIDLER married "according to the customs of the country" 19 yr old Mary MACKEGONNE, a Cree woman from York Factory.



Dec 19, 1796, at Buckingham house, Peter Fidler recorded a temperature of -60F (-51C) "the lowest I ever knew it these 8 years past."

In his will he left his collection of 500 books to be the nucleus of a library which was afterwards absorbed into the Red River library, and of which volumes are to be seen in Winnipeg to this day.



During the summer of 1790, Fidler was the obvious choice to replace HBCo surveyor David Thompson, who fractured his tibia. He was in recovery for the next 2 yrs.

Fall 1792 Peter Fidler oversaw construction of Buckingham House on the high banks of the North Sask River just south east of the present town of Elk Point, Alberta.

In 1796, in charge of Buckingham House while William Tominson was away on leave, Fidler had the first wooden boats built to replace the smaller birch bark canoes.


Peter Fidler's journeys, mostly in western Canada, covered an estimated 48,000 miles on horseback, foot, canoe and dog team.

IRON HORSE TRAIL

- The Iron Horse Trail is a long story of an enthusiastic band of trail builders, who
 convinced the often doubting politicians, local residents and some administrators
 that a trail could work to the local residents' advantage without too much friction
 between trail users and those who lived near the trail. There were plenty of
 justifiable fears in the beginning on both sides and the fierce debate led both sides
 into more passionate argument and, in the end, the public was convinced to give it
 a try (albeit by a narrow vote).
- The years since the start of the discussion have seen a great deal of work done. Some of it was done at the political level. Most of it was done by a hard-working group of enthusiasts who raised money, generated publicity, and got the job done, year in and year out. They won over some of the skeptics and found ways to solve problems. In the beginning we said it was just a dirt path through the landscape but with a lot of energy and cooperation it became more than that.
- It started considerable local tourism, built a recreation corridor very seldom seen, and allowed users and municipal officials to work together to build something only dreamed about in the beginning. As we finish our 7th water pipeline and look at all the infrastructure, knowledge and assets built and maintained over the past 20 odd years we know our labors will not ever be over. The trail is an ongoing project.
- But the Iron Horse Trail project is so vast, it needs a little help reminding us of the gains, the sweat, and the accomplishments.







URBAN FORESTRY

- The Town of Elk Point currently is working on tree planting and has a plan of 10 trees per year. The variety of trees that we have chosen are fruit trees in most areas going forward keeping in mind of the community benefit of organic fruit.
- The Town of Elk Point works in all park areas every year trimming and pruning to ensure that cutting equipment can maintain up to the tree and promote grass growth without dead spots.
- We are careful about the types of trees we are planting to ensure they are under 12 feet in height so as not to interfere with power lines and also avoid underground structure like sewer mains to avoid root interference in lines.
- Every year the Town of Elk Point picks an area for deadfall removal in some of our thicker park areas. This help maintain healthy growth and keep them from becoming a fire hazard.
 - This also helps us with our ditch and drainage areas to keep them flowing. The wood is used by public works for events and also offered to the public.
- The Town of Elk Point has been dealing with black knot problems in some areas and dedicate as much time as we can to prevent the spread.
 - Education for the residents on black knot has also been sent out this year to help prevent the spread and what to do when it is found.
- The Town of Elk Point has placed in the budget this for 2 of our public works employees to be able to get some arborist training which I think would really benefit our department.
- The upgrade is ongoing at our river campground to widen and deepen stalls for the bigger trailers to access our campground.
 - This will see seating added for river viewing thanks to a generous donation from a past superintendent of public works

COMMUNITY GARDENS

The Elk Point Community Garden began as an idea to provide a place where residents young and old could grow their own food; to encourage healthy living and an active lifestyle. The Community Garden committee was formed in the spring of 2023 and in conjunction with the Town of Elk Point settled on the current location directly West of the Elk Point Municipal Library. It's a perfect location being in the middle of town close to all seniors' residences and the local daycare.

The Garden has nine $4 \times 8 \times 2$ raised beds supplied by a local volunteer who also supplied compost for this garden season. The 1000L water tote fills with rain runoff from the library roof and can be filled by the Elk Point Fire Department if needed. The beds are rented per season for a minimal cost to residents who are responsible for planting, weeding and harvesting.

The Community Garden is complemented by beautiful wooden and metal benches supplied by the Town of Elk Point, walking paths that meander around and past Mural Park and the creek that runs through town. The grounds are maintained by the Town of Elk Point maintenance crew.

The Garden committee hopes to expand the site with a gazebo and garden shed.



Healthcare

The Elk Point Healthcare Centre is a fully integrated facility with acute care, continuing care and community health services, including a pharmacy, rehabilitation, recreation and x-ray. Additional healthcare services such as medical clinics, dental care, counselling, chiropractic and pharmaceutical services are located within the Town, with accessible regional services provided through Lakeland Primary Care Network. Elk Point is part of the Rural Health Professions Action Plan (RhPAP) ensuring the community maintains accessible health professionals to serve its residents.



Community Services

Elk Point has a full range of services that include grocery and convenience stores, an award-winning bakery, pharmacy, clothing and variety stores, major hardware, tire and automotive supply outlets, hotels, full-service RV and restaurants.
